Driving Coordinator Job Description

The purpose of this position is to provide support and remove barriers to gaining drivers licences for those seeking work in Kaikōura.

The heart of Te Hā o Mātauranga is about hope and possibility. Our aim is to build capacity. Our approach is strengths based and we aim for transparency in everything we do. These approaches are intentional in devolving power from us as a "helping agent" to building the power of community.

We are looking for a person to provide the programme that includes:

- 1. Obtain the Learners Licence:
 - Teach the theory for the test
 - work one on one with learners
 - run courses with multiple groups of learners
 - Support to read the test questions
 - Support to gain suitable identification for the test
 - Support to book the test
- 2. Obtain their restricted and full licences which involves:
 - Driving groups/individuals to Blenheim/Rangiora for mentoring and the test
 - Arrange mentor days in Kaikōura and Blenheim
 - Work with REAP Marlborough around subsidising mentor lessons
 - Booking tests and helping with identification
- 3. Obtain further licences according to job plans HT, Wheels Tracks and Rollers, Forklift.
- 4. Defensive Driving courses in Kaikoura.
 - Work with REAP Marlborough around subsidising courses
 - Book the instructor
 - Advertise and engage participants
 - Set up venue

- 5. Set up a Community Driving Mentor Programme
 - Investigate NZTA's model
 - Decide on best model for Kaikoura and implement.
- 6. Investigate ways to enable an AA accredited driving trainer to operate in Kaikōura and implement if feasible.
